Request for additional information Lake Disappointment Potash Project, WA

Thank you for submitting a referral under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) concerning the above proposed action.

Our initial examination of your referral indicates that there is insufficient information to allow us to consider all the relevant issues.

The Department has received advice from Geoscience Australia that uranium occurs north of Lake Disappointment and therefore may occur in the lake sediments, groundwater and brine. The Department notes that the referral documentation does not provide data on heavy metal or uranium concentrations occurring within Lake Disappointment including the areas proposed for mining and abstraction.

Given Geoscience Australia's advice, the Department needs to consider whether the proposed action constitutes a nuclear action in accordance with section 22 of the EPBC Act; sections 2.01-2.03 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Regulations 2000* (EPBC Regulations); and the *Australian Radiation Protection and Nuclear Safety Regulations 1999.*

Your proposal could be considered to be a nuclear action as defined by the EPBC Act if it were to result in:

- the mining or milling uranium ore
- establishing or significantly modifying a large-scale disposal facility for radioactive waste
- decommissioning or rehabilitating a facility or area in which an activity described above has been undertaken

If material associated with and/or subject to mining and abstraction in Lake Disappointment is of a sufficient level of radioactivity (as defined in section 2.02 of the EPBC Regulations), your proposal may be considered a nuclear action.

Therefore, to assist the Department in determining whether the proposal is a nuclear action could you please provide the following further information:

- data on major and trace metal concentrations, including uranium and thorium, present in:
 - o sediments, groundwater and brine within Lake Disappointment
 - material associated with the process of mining and abstraction in Lake Disappointment including but not limited to material:
 - produced for transport and sale
 - deposited in any proposed storage facility or waste dump
 - utilised for rehabilitation of the project site
- · activity level of any radioisotopes to be disposed of
- half-life of the radioisotopes
- form of the radioisotopes
- · quantity of radioisotopes handled
- a discussion of the potential for the proposed action to directly or indirectly impact matters of national environmental significance including listed migratory birds through:
 - mobilisation, bioavailability and toxicity of heavy metals (including uranium and thorium)
 - hydrogeochemical changes to lake sediments and waters during wet and dry episodes
 - o generation of acid sulphate soils.

Please note, under subsection 520(4A) of the EPBC Act and the 5.19 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Regulations 2000* your project is subject to cost recovery for the request to provide specific information. You may qualify for an exemption under section 520(4C)(e)(v) of the EPBC Act or apply under Schedule 1 5.21A of the EPBC Regulations for a waiver of the contingency fees.
